

We were going through so much, individually and together. Anxiety. Depression. Our marriage felt rocky; it was like we were both in the same storm, but somehow still miles apart. The hardest part was that neither of us was communicating effectively. We were surviving, but we weren't really connecting.

Then one day, Georgette said one simple thing that changed everything: "I want to go to church." So we went.

From the moment we walked in, something felt different. There are moments in life that feel small on the outside but huge on the inside and when Ms. Frankie prayed for us, it was one of those moments. Something in us settled. We remember thinking, this is home.

What we experienced that day wasn't just friendly, it was real. It was like walking into a place where what had been missing in us was finally being named and cared for.

That's when we started thinking beyond ourselves, too. We live in Scranton and know it has a lot of great food and a lot of bars. And to us, that says something. It says people are running to those places because they're running from something. They're trying to numb the pain, find relief, find belonging, even when they know it doesn't really work.




